The 'best dressed' table was won by Helen Beinke, Sharon Rowe, Tania Woolford, Kath Zaleski, Tara Kenny, Sue Sully, Donna Johnson, Steph Woolford, Katrina King and Emma Bagshaw. Sue Woolford was named 'best dressed', while Jill Dart earned the title of 'worst dressed' with her Op Shop pj's and dressing gown. Annie Lynch drove 2.5 hours down from Moonaree Station where she was rousabouting to attend and was also given a prize for her outfit.

Breast cancer survivor Maxine Barker from Port Lincoln gave a short talk on the 'Look Good, Feel Better' workshops which now occur in most major regional centres for women undergoing breast cancer treatment.
